It has been explained to me the importance of:  Parents being involved at care times  Responsive care  Comfort holding  When the best time is to change a nappy  Comfort during nappy change i.e. side lying change, wrap blanket around arms and shoulders, avoid holding legs in the air, ensure room is warm/adequate incubator temperature and avoid waking the baby  Keeping light, noise and activity levels as low as possible			
<ul> <li>I have been given a demonstration of a nappy change by the nursing staff including:</li> <li>Ensuring room warm/incubator temp adequate</li> <li>Gathering all items needed</li> <li>Approaching baby quietly, talk softly and touch gently</li> <li>Clean skin gently</li> <li>Clean front to back</li> </ul>
